Clark Walker To Discuss His Art and Techniques in a Gallery Talk on Sunday, June 28

Montgomery, AL, June 24, 2015 — The Montgomery Museum of Fine Arts invites the public to hear Clark Walker, the featured artist of the *41st Montgomery Art Guild Museum Exhibition*, discuss his art and demonstrate his drawing techniques in the Museum on Sunday at 2 P.M. The event is free to the public.

The Montgomery Art Guild, a dynamic organization of local artists for the advancement of the arts in our city, holds a juried exhibition with the Museum of Fine Arts every other year. Alongside the well-established and up-and-coming local artists selected to be in the show, the guild elects to exhibit the works of one of its distinguished members, this year Clark Walker. Many of Clark Walker's paintings currently on view at the Museum are of the poignant people, pets, performers he is most famous for and also include still-lives, self-portraits, and a folded screen painted with natural imagery. The selection of Walker's work reflects a variety of media and eras of the artist's career and will be on display in the Museum through August 9, thanks to the generosity of a dozen collectors who have loaned paintings and drawings for the exhibition. The artist was on hand at the opening reception to discuss his work and answer questions, as he will be again this Sunday, with the added opportunity for patrons to see him draw live.
