Color and Form: A Student Art Exhibition

Exhibition Connection: Lino Tagliapietra Master of Beauty

Artwork Due: Friday, November 2, 2018

Exhibition Dates: November 17 through January 20, 2019

Eligibility: Kindergarten through 12th grade

Reception: Thursday, December 4, 2018, at 5:30 P.M.

Project: Inspired by the work of glass artist Lino Tagliapietra on view in the Museum's galleries, students are asked to explore different techniques and materials that highlight color and form in a powerful way. Using two of the basic elements of art to create works that bring color and form to the forefront, the student exhibition promises to be a vibrant and powerful display. Students are invited to create works that are inspired by the pieces represented in the Museum's exhibition of Tagliapietra's work. Submissions may include prints, paint, sculpture, photography and/or other mixed media. Only one work per student will be accepted.

Size: Entries may be no larger than 24" x 24" (they may be smaller than this). Photographs and works on paper must be properly presented in mats. Three-dimensional works of art may not exceed six inches in depth and must be ready to hang on the wall.
