Students are invited to create artworks that are inspired by the prints in the exhibition. Submissions may include prints, paintings, sculpture, photography, or mixed media. Entries may not include food or edible pieces.

Eligibility: Kindergarten through College

Size: Artworks may be no larger than 24 x 24 inches. Photographs and works on paper must be properly presented in mats. Three-dimensional works of art may not exceed six inches in depth and must be ready to hang on the wall.
